This full-time position includes teaching middle school math for two periods per day and an additional five periods in high school level math or science, depending on the passions of the teacher hired and the needs of Concordia. The ideal candidate is dedicated to fostering academic excellence, critical thinking, and spiritual growth while maintaining a Christ-centered approach to education.

Position Responsibilities

1. Faith Integration: Model and integrate Christian faith into teaching, rehearsals, and interactions with students, helping them understand music as a gift to glorify God.
2. Student Development: Foster students' analytical growth, encourage curiosity, and provide constructive feedback on problem-solving techniques and scientific methodology.
3. Curriculum Planning and Implementation: Maintain and implement a dynamic, Christ-centered curriculum aligned with educational standards and school goals. This position may include:
 - Mathematics: Instruct middle and high school students in pre-algebra, algebra, and/or geometry concepts.
 - High School Life Science: Teach high school courses such as biology and ecology.
4. Differentiated Instruction: Adapt teaching methods to meet the diverse needs of students, offering support for those struggling with complex concepts and enrichment for advanced learners.
5. Classroom Management: Create a supportive, disciplined, and inclusive classroom environment where students feel encouraged to ask questions and take intellectual risks.
